

Notes for introduction to the domain session

- Basic information about organization of WCI – two main organizational vectors
 - a. Vertical and local – linking universities and local organizations
 - b. Horizontal – research domains cut across institutions; permit specialization by ‘slicing’ the WCI into policy-research areas.
- Basic information about the role of domain leaders
 - a. Vis-à-vis the domain (promote intellectual rigour and quality)
 - b. Vis-à-vis the project (gathering ‘intelligence’ from local engagement activities and work collaboratively with local institutions to transform this intelligence into research; serve as key engine of project growth through encouragement of applications and links to federal and provincial ministries.
- Where we stand in terms of organizing the domains
 - a. Have experienced some turnover and replacement ... start-up issues
 - b. Have 8 domains of which 6 now have 2 co-domain leaders; 2 domains have only 1 leader and are in the process of recruiting a second one. Expect to stabilize by year-end.
- Situating the present exercise
 - a. Description of what domain leaders were asked to do (reach out and start building a network, convene other researchers, take a first cut at defining the scope of the domain, establish priorities and identify where policy contributions can be made).
 - b. Present exercise and purpose of presentations is to expand these consultations - in particular, to get more feedback from local actors ... input from federal and provincial officials will come later (not sufficiently represented at workshop to undertake this).
- How we will conduct ourselves during the session
 - Sequential 7 minute presentations followed by discussion with audience
- The job of the audience – and of the presenters - is to listen for the following 5 things:
 - a. Does the research speak sufficiently to the concerns of 2nd and 3rd tier cities (as distinct from, say, Toronto, etc.) ??
 - b. Are there important topics that have been left out or that require more emphasis ??
 - c. Will the research engage the concerns of local stakeholders ??
 - d. Will the research address the concerns of federal and provincial ministries ??
 - e. Are there opportunities for collaboration and cross-domain research ??
