Level of Coordination Among Service Providers	Fall 2011 Fall 2012 Fall 2013	In response to the restructuring of Hamilton's settlement service sector
Contributions from HIPC Partners (in-kind and fiscal)	Winter 2013 Winter 2014	Working groups fully functioning for over a year Inquiries from CIC
Progress in Addressing the Strategic Priorities Identified in the Immigration Strategy	Winter 2013	The HIPC requested progress evaluation at the 5 year mark

Service Provider Survey

Method

- Online survey
- Distributed to all sectors of the community
- Questions focused on making referrals

Results

- 378 respondents
- Increased knowledge of other services
- HIPC web and print materials most useful

Next Steps

- Results informed Work Plan
- Revised survey and re-administered (focus collaborative methods)

Partner Contribution & Impact Survey

Method

- Online survey
- Distributed to all HIPC partners
- Questions focused on type/amount of contribution and impact

Results

- 65 respondents
- \$1.5 million contributed (in-kind and fiscal)
- Greater collaboration, greater awareness of newcomer issues, increased integration of newcomer issues into policies and plans

Next Steps

- Reworked survey and re-administer (focus on partnerships)

Project Progress Report

Method

- Document analysis
- Mapping against HIPC's Immigration Strategy

Results

- 43 out of 56 strategic actions have been addressed (77%)
- Stakeholders are working together in innovative ways
- Robust evidence-based knowledge
- Evidence of systemic change

Next Steps

- Review Immigration Strategy for relevance and incorporate unmet strategic actions into 2014-15 Work Plan
- Developing a collective impact framework and evaluation plan
