The Hamilton Centre for Civic Inclusion (HCCI) is a community based organization with a mandate to create a welcoming and inclusive city.



The Hamilton Immigration Partnership Council (HIPC) is a multi-sector local immigration partnership (LIP) funded by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and supported by the city of Hamilton.

Our 2017-2020 vision is a Hamilton that "welcomes newcomers, celebrates diversity and is a place for everyone to call home"

What is #HamiltonforAll?

The 1st phase of the **#HamiltonForAll** campaign will focus on celebrating diversity and inspiring Hamilton residents to connect with and welcome newcomers. The results of this campaign will support 2017-2020 Hamilton Immigration Partnership vision of a Hamilton that *welcomes newcomers, celebrates diversity, and is a place for everyone to call home.*

The **#HamiltonforAll** campaign builds on the Ontario Council of Agencies Serving Immigrants (OCASI) and the city of Toronto **#TorontoForAll** campaigns and the town of Ajax **#AjaxForAll** campaigns that have addressed racism, xenophobia, islamophobia and other issues.

The campaign will engage Hamiltonians in welcoming newcomers, conversations, learning and inspire actions throughout the city over a period of 6 months.

Welcoming actions inspired by the campaign will be submitted by the community members and organizations through the hamiltonforall.ca website to be included on a map of Hamilton to be presented at Hamilton's 1st ever "Newcomer Day" in May 2018




#HamiltonforAll – Plan Phase 1




