Why do we need it?

- Increasing need for a coherent national narrative around newcomers and integration.
- Secretariat could enhance LIP voices in policy discussions at sector decision making tables, including in health, employment, etc.
- As the number of LIPs grows, we can benefit from increased coordination, collaboration, and decreased fragmentation on issues.
- Secretariat could increase efficiency and decrease unnecessary administrative burdens.
- Secretariat could facilitate communication with others (IRCC, umbrellas, provincial governments.)
- Secretariat would serve as a resource for emerging LIPs.
- Secretariat would enhance our capacity for intentional information sharing leading to enhanced evidence-based decision making by local Councils.



newcomers; research; local collectives and priorities)


Provincial/Territorial umbrellas (which are informed by settlement agencies, LIPs, research, newcomers and local collectives)

IRCC regions: BC/Yukon; PNT; ONT; Atlantic; Regions that are similar in composition

IRCC nationwide scope (which is informed by government policy and priorities). National Settlement Council.

Considerations that cut across geographic regions that should be taken into account for equitable representation:

- Urban/Rural split
- Large/Small centres
- SPO/Municipal contribution-agreement holder
- Clusters
- Temporary issue-based subject matter experts on arising topics
