








## Selecting a specific group of newcomers

# Parents of refugee/immigrant children: Highest Education at landing





### Parents of refugee/immigrant children: Knowledge of official language at landing




## Household income (1980-2015)

Age at First Earnings of Immigrant and Refugee Children and Youth by Landing Category (1980-2000 Cohort)







- Population of immigrant tax filer records
- Detailed information on individual characteristics/outcomes
- Longitudinal data collection: tracking individuals overtime
- Offers "contextual" evidence base for various programs
