# Pathways to Prosperity 2020 National Conference The Future of Immigration and (Re)Settlement in Canada

#### **A Virtual Conference**

Pathways to Prosperity is pleased to be holding a virtual conference this year in lieu of our usual annual national conference, with many of the features of our in-person conferences for which we have come to be known. This includes plenaries, a keynote speaker, workshops, posters, exhibitors, and opportunities to network with colleagues. Join researchers, service providers, Local Immigration Partnerships, Réseaux en immigration francophone, representatives of all levels of government, and others working in the area of immigration for a three-day event on immigration in an increasingly complex environment.

On Monday November 23 and Tuesday November 24, the P2P Annual National Conference will run from 11:00 AM EST to 4:45 PM EST, with evening activities on November 23 for interested parties. The conference will focus on immigration and (re)settlement in Canada in this time of a world-wide pandemic and increased awareness of the racism and discrimination facing immigrants every day. We will discuss the challenges and opportunities for change now and in the coming years.

On Wednesday November 25, the full day conference for Local Immigration Partnerships and Réseaux en immigration francophone will run from 11:00 AM EST to 4:45 PM EST, focusing on upcoming priorities set by these collaborative enterprises.

#### **Call for Workshops**

On November 23 and 24, we will be holding concurrent workshop sessions. This year we are inviting workshop submissions on timely topics relevant to current immigration and (re)settlement in Canada - e.g., the impact of COVID-19 on immigration and (re)settlement in Canada; new services or ways of delivering services in response to COVID-19 restrictions; the impact

of racism on immigrants to Canada; immigrant-indigenous relations; and other current topics. Workshop sessions will be 75 minutes and should include a chair and 3-4 speakers, leaving sufficient time for discussion. To submit a workshop proposal, please <u>click here</u>. Workshops in English and French are invited. We must receive your workshop submission by Friday, September 25 in order for it to be considered. Acceptance of workshops will be announced by Monday, October 5. Please note that all accepted workshop chairs and presenters must register for the conference and pay the applicable registration fees.
