He is the author of *Flying Fish in the Great White North: The Autonomous Migration of Black Barbadians*, published by Fernwood Publishing. He has served as the Diversity and Inclusion Coordinator in the Ontario Ministry of the Attorney General's Diversity, Inclusion &

Accessibility Office; a Senior Policy Advisor at Ontario's Anti-Racism Directorate; and Manager of Social Justice & Change Cluster at the Ontario Correctional Services College. Dr. Taylor teaches in the Department of History and the Arts First Program at the University of Waterloo.
