North Shore Context



Mid-sized community across Burrard Inlet from Vancouver

- 192,557 total population
- 3 municipalities and 2 First Nations
- 2% indigenous residents
- 38% immigrants
- 31% visible minorities
- Top countries of birth for recent immigrants: Iran & China

Knowledge Mobilization Goals

- 1. Create "spotlights": surface the invisible
 - Hone in on pressing and hidden issues
- 2. Provoke transformational learning
 - Head + heart = hands (action!)
- 3. Center inclusion in activities
 - Accessibility of data; new & old wisdoms





Examples: Strategies & Tools (1)

COVID-19 impacts on the labour market and North Shore im/migrant job seekers

- Surfacing the experiences of temporary permit holders
- Heightened digital literacy needs in im/migrant communities

Activities:

- Community surveys (& data tracking)
- Workshops at NSIIP Service Provider's Forum
- Lunch & Learn community series
- North Shore technology resources map
- Re-skilling opportunities aligned with talent needs



Examples: Strategies & Tools (2)

Examining experiences of racism & hate-based incidents in North Shore communities

- Honoring truths & identifying community supports
- Exploring racial equity frameworks & data collection approaches




Activities:
