Members of NCCYL lead discussions and projects, and advocate for themselves and other newcomer youth with the guidance and resources of the New Canadians Centre.

NCCYL GUIDELINES



WHAT IS NCCYL'S GOAL?

To help other newcomer youth and make them feel welcome in the community, whilst gaining leadership skills in the process.

HOW WILL WE ACHIEVE OUR GOAL?

By creating meaningful experiences through projects for newcomer youth to engage with the community and integrate in Canadian culture, whilst holding pride in their own background and culture.



WHY?

- To support youth in gaining leadership skills
- To Empower youth by giving them a platform to build, rather than attend
- To create a space where they can learn and practice self advocacy, and advocate for others
- Serves as a needs assessment for youth



HOW?

- 1st cohort September 2020 May 2021
- Recruitment interested youth with newcomer experience*

- Platform virtual meetings weekly










- Building something from the ground up
