






What is GBA Plus?

- An analytical process to assess how diverse groups experience policies and services.
- The 'Plus' = race, ethnicity, religion, class, ability, age, immigration status.
- Beyond gender to address systems of power, privilege, and exclusion.
- GBA Plus helps identify who is missing from the conversation, program, initiative and plans to address that or to mitigate the impact.




















Why GBA Plus Matters

- Uncovers assumptions and systemic barriers.
- Promotes inclusive, data-driven program design.
- Aligns with human-rights legislation (Bill C-16)
- Leads to better access and outcomes for diverse communities.
- Improves accessibility and outcomes for all.

SELF-LEARNING & GROUP ACTIVITIES FOR INCLUSIVE PROGRAMMING-TOOL

- Builds awareness and skills to apply intersectionality in real program and service design.
- Promotes reflection on how gender, race, ability, age, and other identity factors shape clients' experiences.
- Encourages teams to explore "Who benefits—and who might be left out?"
- PLLC experience: adapted for staff and small-group use.

PURPOSE

This tool aims to enhance the understanding of intersectionality and how we can apply intersectionality to support groups with unique vulnerabilities. These activities facilitate better application of GBA Plus principles within organizational staff, fostering a deeper and more practical comprehension through individual or small team engagement.

TWO OF THE ACTIVITIES THAT SUPPORT YOUR LEARNING ARE:



The Intersectionality Reflection activity involves watching Kimberlé Crenshaw's "The Urgency of Intersectionality" video. This prompts readers to consider systemic barriers affecting newcomer and immigrant populations, followed by reflection questions.



Applying a **GBA Plus Lens** activity requires watching a video about a client's story and reflecting on strategies to provide quality and inclusive services.




