## **Context – Living in Toronto CMA**

- 2023-2024: grew by 222,000 (5 x more than the average over the previous decade)
- More than 2.7 million people say they are **struggling to get by** (700,000 more than in 2023)
- 50% + population **earning below the living wage**
- Local organizations that exist to support vulnerable Torontonians are at the breaking point as service demands keep going up

57% Scaled back programs 27% Have more waitlists 10% Discontinued programs



## **Context – Working in Non-Profits in Toronto**

- Toronto non-profit sector generates \$14 billion in annual revenue = > 8% of Toronto's GDP
- Only 7% of funding is from municipal government (93% from other sources)
- The sector provides >105,000 FT jobs & >100,000 PT jobs
- 1.7 million volunteer hours
- 14,000+ organizations

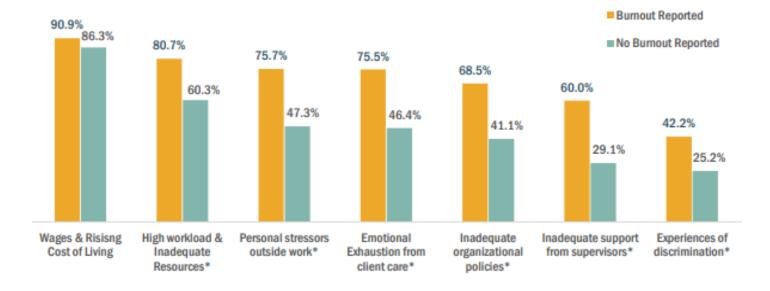
## **Context - Working in Settlement Sector in Toronto**

2,450 organizations providing services specifically for newcomers to Toronto

#### **Settlement Sector Staff**

#### 41.1% reported burnout

- 75.2% reported poor mental health
- 48.6% screened positive for depression

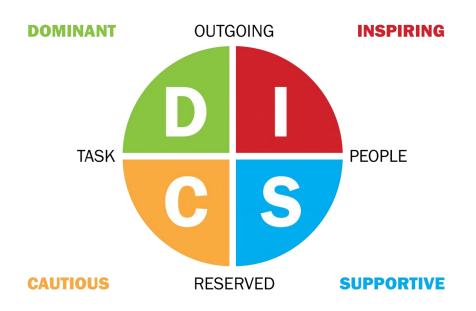


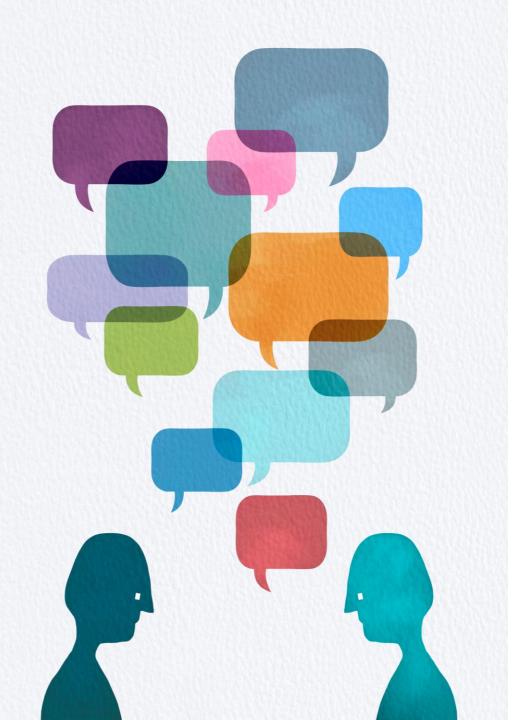

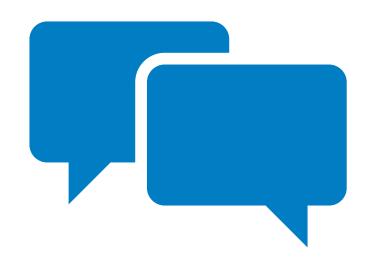
